



The **Mayfair**, Sydney was the first city theatre in Australia to be equipped for Todd-AO 70mm presentation. Starting out life as a boxing ring, the **National Amphitheatre** opened on the 26th December, 1906, with James Brennan as proprietor. In 1919, Sir Benjamin and John Fuller became sole directors of the National and renamed the venue **Fullers' New Theatre**. Films were programmed at times from the late 1920s. On 28th February, 1930 the theatre premiered its first sound presentation - **The Hollywood**

Revue - as the newly christened **Roxy Theatre**. The Roxy was renamed the Mayfair Theatre on the 24th March, 1932 with the gala premiere of **Carnival**. The theatre was refurbished in 1935 and renamed the **New Mayfair De-Luxe** - presenting predominately British Dominion films. In 1936, the Mayfair was acquired by Snider and Dean Theatres Ltd. during the season of **Scrooge**. During WW2 Snider and Dean Theatres merged with Hoyts Theatres - at which time the Mayfair came under the banner of National Theatres Corporation. On the 19th December 1946, Hoyts Theatres became sole proprietor of the Mayfair during the season of **Without Reservations**. The theatre's first film to be screened in CinemaScope was **Woman's World** - which opened on the 9th December, 1954. The Mayfair closed Wednesday 10th December, 1958 for installation of DP70 projectors and a Westrex 6-Track Magnetic Stereophonic Sound System. It reopened with the premiere of **South Pacific** and the featurette, **The Miracle of Todd-AO** [30fps]. The premiere took place on the 24th December, 1958. Many 70mm films followed including: **West Side Story**, **Cleopatra**, and **The Sound of Music**. Hoyts vacated the Mayfair after the 16th February, 1977 evening session of **Notorious!** The Mayfair reopened four months later, albeit briefly, with the Lenny Bruce performance film, **Lenny**, a double bill of **Jimi** (Hendrix) **Plays Berkeley** and **Goodbye Cream**, **Pink Floyd: Live in Pompeii** and **Yessongs**. Then, the theatre closed again, before reverting to a legitimate theatre. This shift came with a season of **Godspell '78** and other live shows performances which included: **Shakespeare's Othello**, **Father's Day** and **Crown Matrimonial**. Despite efforts by Australian celebrities not to close the theatre, the Mayfair was demolished in 1980. A multi-storey office tower now occupies the site.
