

The New Paris was built on the site of the former Plaza Theatre, which had been renamed the Paris for *The Sound of Music*. The New Paris was located behind Adelaide's Regent Theatre and opened with Star! in 70mm on the 17<sup>th</sup> April 1969. The New Paris would later be known as the Regent 2. After the launch of single lens Cinerama at the Plaza theatres in Sydney and Melbourne, most Hoyts city cinema construction/conversions around the country in the late 1960s/early70s were equipped with curved screens and pairs of official 'Cinerama' lenses - reportedly built by Applied Optics and Mechanics in California which were supplied at no charge by Cinerama, Inc. Those venues were the renovated Adelaide Regent, as well as the Paris, Perth Cinema One. and Melbourne Hoyts Cinema Centre. By 1969 the 'Cinerama era' had effectively ended and the Adelaide season of Ice Station Zebra at the Paris was the only time any of those lenses were officially used.
