'Okla.' Now Will Preem At NY Rivoli Sept. 22

New York, July 21. — Opening date of Magna Theatre Corp.'s "Oklahoma," first film in the Todd-AO widescreen process, has been tentatively set for Sept. 22 at the Rivoli Theatre here.

New screen, developed by Todd-AO and measuring 65 ft by 25 ft, with a depth of 13 ft. (approximately the Cinerama dimensions), is being installed. Apart from being highly reflectant, it has no seams. Delay in the "Oklahoma" opening is due in part to the Skouras Theatres' reluctance to go ahead with alterations some months back when it was uncertain whether L. B. Mayer would agree to a renewal of the lease. This problem was settled in late June.
